HOW WAS OUR JULY?

This month, CO-HATY started working at the new location, the third one in Ivano-Frankivsk. It is a former building of the department of education. After the renovation, it will provide housing for people who found shelter in city schools.

The capacity of this building is **157 people.**



WHAT WE ARE DOING AT THE BUILDING

First of all, we did the assessment of necessary works, prepared a design project, and had a cleaning – cleaned spaces of old and broken furniture, took out the trash, and cleaned the yard.

The refurbishment of this building will include:

- repairing the heating and electrical systems;
- replanning part of the private rooms and bathrooms;
- repairing the walls and floors;
- designing and constructing the furniture;
- providing household appliances and items;
- making the first floor accessible for people with disabilities.

The renovation of the building is financed by the Ukraine Confidence Building Initiative (UCBI III), funded by the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID).



AND HOW IS THE HOTEL RENOVATION GOING?

The work at the hotel continues. In July, our volunteers and contractors:

- finished putting a new roof over the main building;
- continued replacing heating, water supply, and sewerage systems;
- applied putty to the walls on several floors;
- leveled the floors and made screed to put linoleum;
- made additional doorways;
- built partitions for the rooms.



CONSULTING OTHER CITIES

GIZ invited the CO-HATY team to share our expertise and support other local organizations that are also creating housing for internally displaced people.

Architects and constructors from our team visited Zhytomyr and Lviv. In the first city, they are consulting on the creation of public space nearby the housing for IDPs. In Lviv, they participated in the workshop for designing furniture for places of collective residence.

Consulting is supported by the project "Integrated Urban Development in Ukraine II," implemented by the German federal enterprise "Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) GmbH" with the support of the German and Swiss governments.

COLLABORATION WITH NEW HOUSING POLICY

We started cooperation with the experts of the New Housing Policy project. Their team describes with laws and regulations the housing model created by CO-HATY. It is needed for better communication with local administrations and other involved parties.

In their work, New Housing Policy focuses on developing new principles of creation, distribution, and maintenance of housing.

The work in spheres of:

- urban management;
- operational models for places of compact residence;
- housing policies

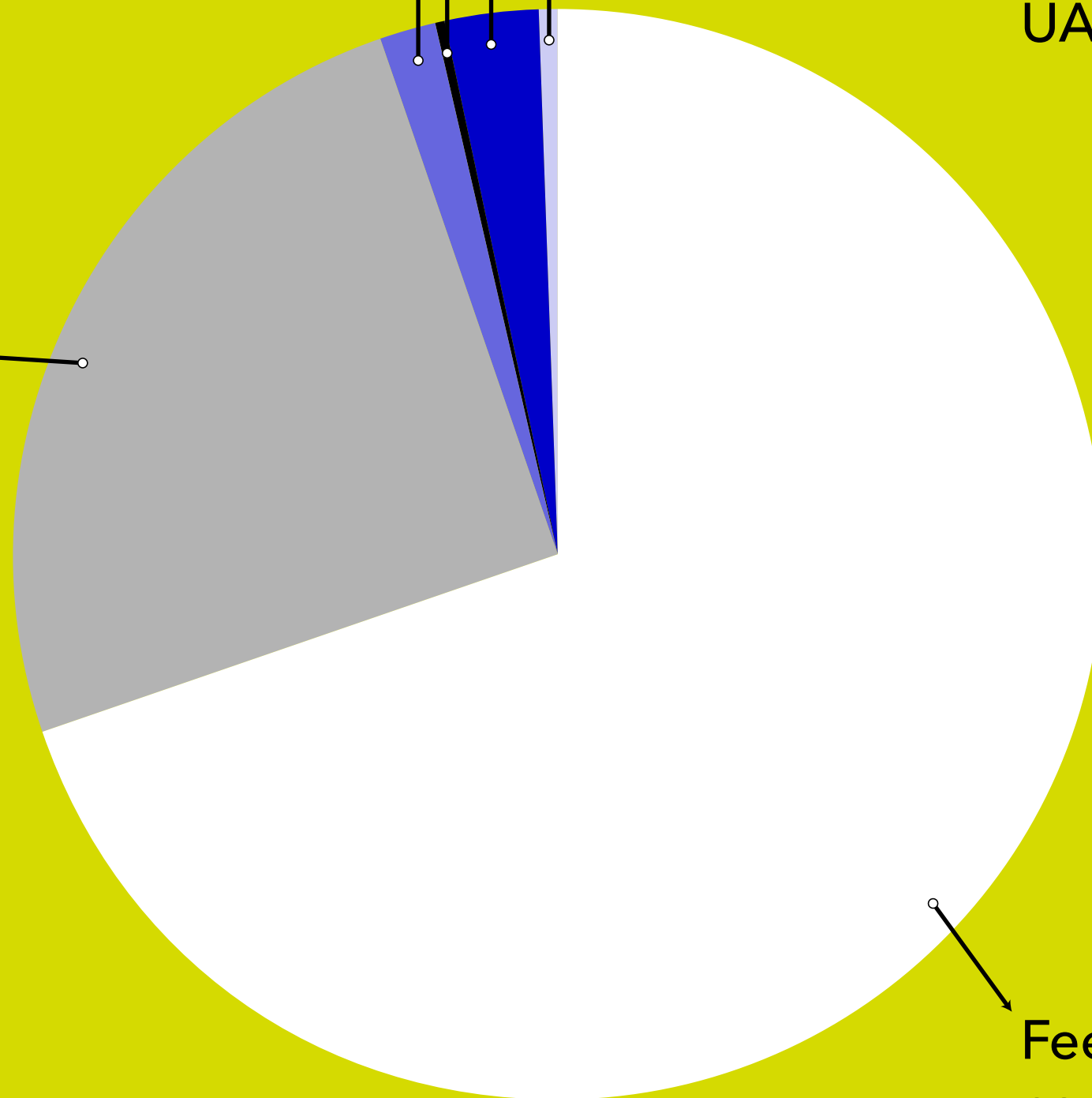
